PRESIDENTIAL REPORT.

In his annual report the President was able to report an increase in the number of affiliations to the Association and that all Egg Circles were now members. Total membership is 5,358, subject to minor alterations from late returns.

The poultry industry has been hard hit by the high price of mealies and wheat and it was estimated that there was a decrease of 25 per cent. to 32 per cent. in the poultry population, due mainly to economic factors, of which high production costs was the chief. Fluctuations in production, such as this reduction means, is a definite handicap to orderly and efficient marketing. He criticised the policy of the Mealie Control Board of raising internal prices to cover loss on export and of the fixation of a price to producers, which did not ensure a reasonable degree of efficiency in production and economic farming, while the granting of special rebates or facilities to producers of export meat and the loading of the burden of support of one section of the community upon the shoulders of an equally hard hit section, was described as iniquitous. If any section of the community needs supporting, then the burden should be that of the nation as a whole. The effect of industrialism as a cure for the economic difficulties of primary producers was dismissed with the statement of the position in U.S.A. and Great Britain, where special protection has had to be given to Agriculture, but without bringing any real hope of permanent relief.

Attention was drawn to the serious position of the poultry industry in the United States and Great Britain owing to widespread disease in flocks, which were being decimated. The drastic and costly steps being taken to remedy the position overseas called for precautions to be adopted in the Union to prevent a similar position arising. Co-operation and assistance was asked in

PRESIDENT SE VERSLAG.

In sy Jaarverslag het die President melding gemaak van die vermeerdering in die getal affiliasies, en ook dat alle Eierkrings nou lede is. Die ledetal staan op 5,358, dit afhangend op minderwaardige veranderinge wat aanbrenging sal word wanneer alle verslae ontvang is.

Die hoë prys van mielies en koring het die pluimveebedryf erg beseer, en dit is geskat dat daar 'n vermindering vanaf 25 persent tot 32 persent in die pluimvee getalle plaasgevind het, wens ekonomiese faktore waarvan produksie koste die vernameste is. Oordelike en doeltreffende bemerking is met wisselvallige produksie baie moeilik. Die President het die beleid van die Mealie Beheerraad aangaande die verhoging van die binnelandse prys om die verliese op uitvoer te dek gekritiseer, asook die prys vaststelling vir produsente wat nie doeltreffend of ekonomies produseer nie. Hy het ook die beleid om spesiale voorregte te verleen aan produsente van uitvoerveis, sodat een afdeling van die bevolking die las van 'n ander een moet dra, as onseggend beskryf. As enige seksie van die bevolking hulp nodig het, dan behoort die las onder die hele nase verdeel te word. Die gevolge van 'n industriële beleid as 'n geneesmiddel vir die ekonomiese moeilikheid van primêre produsente is in 'n verslag oor die pensie in die Verenigde State en Groot Brittanje afgehandel; daar moes spesiale beskerming aan landbou verleen word, en het weinig werklike verligting aangebring.

Melding is gemaak van die ernstige posisie van die Pluimveebedryf in Amerika en Engeland wens die verspreiding van siekte. Die drastiese en duur stappe wat tanses saam geneem moet word om gesondheid te herstel, is geneem as 'n bewys dat om 'n soortgelyke posisie in die Unie te voorkom, moet stappe nou hier geneem

drawing up a scheme on this subject. The difficulties would be many, as in the carrying out of the B.W.D. Scheme, which was a step in the desired direction and in any marketing scheme which also had to be tackled. The industry as a whole had to be considered and individual liberty to do widespread harm had to be prevented even if it meant regulations which imposed certain restrictions which might be irksome to many.

The delay in securing a Government decision upon the S.A.P.A. proposed Marketing Scheme for the Rand was deplored, as this matter was of vital importance to producer and consumer.

One or two weaknesses in the working of the National Mark Scheme were indicated in the advertising of eggs without indication of grade or size, was particularly mentioned.

The decision of the Government not to undertake further R.O.P. inspection work was sharply criticised and reasons given for asking for a reversal of this decision. Refusal would mean discrimination in the giving of services of officers of the Department to the detriment of the poultry industry.

Progress in showing had not been made, though quality of exhibits showed improvement. It was pointed out that the remedy lay with the clubs and only activity on their part, particularly with commercial egg farmers and Boys' and Girls' Clubs would have the desired effect.

Proposals for the granting of All-round Judges' Certificates were mentioned and the appointment of Junior Judges again recommended to give experience to young judges.

Additional support for the Championship Show was thought essential, but the dissatisfaction of one or two Clubs with the activities of the Board on Show matters was sharply dealt with. It was pointed out that if further work was to be undertaken, or even the present activities continued without unfair and undue added worry being placed upon the Executive, further finance must be provided by affiliations. Clubs were roundly accused of failing to give adequate support and assistance to the Association, and the fact that they had not even secured a single advertisement for the Bulletin, quoted as an instance of their laxness and failure to undertake a reasonable share of work in making the Association a success. The need for greater membership was stressed and particularly the necessity of securing individual members where poultrymen would not or could not join affiliations.

Thanks were expressed to voluntary contributors to the Bulletin and to advertisers who had made the issue possible. Members were asked to show appreciation of this fact by supporting the firms concerned.

The Secretary for Agriculture was thanked for the support and assistance given by the Department in many ways, one in particular being the granting of services of Officers of the Department to act as Judges at Shows. Serious disappointment and amazement at certain aspects of the treatment of the Association at the hands of the Department were, however, recorded. The importance of the Association's widespread activities to the poultry industry were mentioned, and

word. Samewerking en hulp is gevra van die B.W.D. Skema wat 'n stap in die regte rigting is, en in enige bemerkingskema wat ook aangepak moet word. Sleigs die bedryf as 'n geheel moet in aanmerking geneem word, en voorgegemaakte teenoor die verspreiding van siektes, ens. sal moet geneem word, al sou dit ook regulasies en sekere lastige beperkings veroorsaak.

Ons betreur die vertraging deur die Goewerment om tot 'n besluit te kom oor die S.A.P.V. Bemerkingskema vir die Rand, want dit is 'n saak van uiters belang vir beide producent en verbruiker.

Die aandag van lede is attent gemaak op enkele swakkeite in die werking van die Nasionale Merk Skema vir so ver as die advertensie van eiers sonder om melding te maak van die graad of grootte.

Die besluit van die Goewerment om R.V.P. inspeksies te staak is streng gekritiseer, en die Goewerment is gevra om hulle besluit te heroen en rede vir die versoek is ook aangegee. As aan ons versoek nie gehoor word nie dan bewys die Goewerment onderskeiding in die dienste van die beamptes, wat tot die nadeel van die pluimveebedryf sal wees.

Tentoonstellings het alleen vir suwer kwaliteit van voël saggan vertering gemaak. Dit is daarop gewys dat die klubs alleen 'n verbetering kan aanbring en dit alleen deur verdere aktieweities, vernameik met kommersieel pluimveeboere en seuns' en dogters' klubs sal die verlangte resultate verkry word.

Die voorstelle vir die uitroking van Algemene Beoordelaars Sertifikate is melding van gemaak asook die aanstelling van Junior Beoordelaars vir die verkry van ondervinding is weer voorgestel.

Al is dit as essensieel beskou dat finansiële ondersteuning aan die Kampioenskap Tentoonstelling verleen word, is die ontevredeheid van enkele klubs oor die aktieweities van die Raad aangaande tentoonstelling sake kragtig afgehandel. Dit is aangehoor dat as verdere bewerksaamhede onderneem moet word, of alleen die voorsit van teenswoordige aktieweities sonder om meer laste of bekommernisse op die Uitvoerende Raad te pak, sal verdere finansiële deur affiliasies verkaf moet word. Klubs is beskuldig dat hulle nie voldoende ondersteuning en hulp aan die Vereniging verleen nie, en die feit dat hulle nie een enkele advertensie vir die „Bulletin“ verkry het nie, is as 'n bewys van hulle laksheid gegee. Nadruk is geel op die noodsaaklikheid vir 'n groter ledetal, vernameik die verkry as individuele lede dingere wie nie by affiliasies wil of kan aansluit nie.

Dank is oorgeda aan diegene wat vrywillig bydrae tot die „Bulletin“ gemaak het, asook aan adverteerders wat die uitgee van die blad moontlik gemaak het. Lede is gevra om hulle waardering te bewys deur hulle ondersteuning aan die betrokke firma te verleen.

Die Sekretaris van Landbou is bedank vir die ondersteuning en hulp wat deur die Departement in baie opsigte gegee is, vernameik deur die verleen van beamptes as beoordelaars op tentoonstellings. Melding is egter gemaak van die feit dat alleen tentoonstelling en verbasing kan die behandeling van die Vereniging deur die Departement op sekere wye

Chairman: Mr. E. M. Talmash presided over the Conference as Chairman.

Opening of Conference: The Thirty-fourth Annual Conference was opened by His Worship the Mayor of Bloemfontein, Councillor W. F. Prophet.

Address: Mr. B. P. Jones, Chairman of the Bloemfontein Chamber of Commerce, addressed the meeting.

Notice of Conference: The Secretary read the notice convening Conference.

Government Officials: The Chairman extended an invitation to all Government Officials present to take part in any debate.

Minutes: The Minutes of the Thirty-third Annual Conference of the Association as circularised to all affiliations were taken as read, confirmed and signed.

Arising out of the Minutes: Mr. Black (Bloemfontein) queried the action of the Board granting the Championship Show to Pietermaritzburg after Conference had granted the Show to Johannesburg.

The circumstances were explained and Conference confirmed the action of the Board.

Report of the Central Board: The Report of the Central Board as printed on pages 4, 5 and 6 of the March, 1938, issue of the "Bulletin" was taken as read and adopted.

Report by the President: The President submitted his annual report, which was very favourably commented up by several delegates and adopted.

Lengthy discussion on many phases of the report ensued, and several relevant resolutions were tabled under "General."

Balance Sheet and Financial Statement: The Balance Sheet and Revenue and Expenditure Statement for the year ended 31st December, 1937, and as printed on page 7 of the March, 1938, issue of the "Bulletin" was adopted.

Various items were discussed, and it was suggested that Special Prizes at Shows should be made eligible for ring birds only in order to encourage the greater use of Official Rings. It was agreed that the Central Board depreciate the value of the Show Pens by £20 at the end of 1938, bringing their value to £60.

"To tax through a Control Scheme only one section of the community specifically to maintain another section of the community in order to carry out a policy of the Government is unjustifiable, especially where the taxed are already meeting serious difficulties, and the majority of whom are likely to be deprived of their livings. It appeals to the Ministers to act in justice and equity to all sections, a principle claimed as his by the Prime Minister at Smithfield on 5th April, 1938."

South African Railways and Harbours.

Resolution No. 9. Carried with the amendment that the words "in Natal" be inserted after "improvement" in the second line, and with the addition of the words "and bring conditions in other Provinces into line."

 2. Light Breeds to approved holders of three Certificates for any variety in three Light Breeds.
 3. All Games and Game Bantams, including Indian, to holders of a Certificate secured for special examination embracing All Games.

4. Bantams other than Games to approved holders of a Certificate secured for a special examination embracing All Bantams.
5. Waterfowl to holders of Certificates for one Heavy Bred Duck, one Light Bred Duck, and one Goose.
6. Miscellaneous (Turkeys, Table Poultry and Eggs) to approved holders of one Certificate for Turkeys and one for Table Poultry and Eggs.

(b) That an All-round Certificate be granted to approved holders of three Certificates, these to be held in different sections of those enumerated above, one to be in Sections 1 to 3.

NOTE.—(1) Judges under (a) and (b) to have completed the examinations as at present in force, and names to be submitted to the Judges' Association by Show-holding Clubs.

(2) Certificates held must be in separate breeds.

(c) Judges other than (a) and (b) above to receive sectional Certificates without examination if

(i) They have judged two or more breeds at at least five approved Shows.

(ii) They are recommended by the Club of which they are a member and, if possible, approved by Specialist Clubs concerned.

(d) These Certificates will only be granted when the application is approved by any Annual General Meeting of the Judges' Association and upon payment of a fee of 10/6 for each sectional certificate or £1 Is. for an All-round Certificate.

(e) That the necessary amendments to the Rules and Regulations be effected."

"Conference approves that holders of Judges' Certificates of Old English Game be recognised as Judges of Old English Game Bantams."

Facts and Fallacies

By A. J. LUCAS.

CRITICS.

From time to time we meet with criticism (often from those who have no pecuniary interest in the industry except the payment for writing about it) to the effect that the Poultry Industry is not expanding.

The nature of these criticisms indicate a belief that there is no limit to which the industry may grow, and setback (generally from causes outside the control of poultrymen) is a serious reflection on the ability of those who are endeavouring to combat, on behalf of the industry, the problems which seem to increase in number with the passing of time. While we do not admit any justification for this implication, we feel that little imagination seems to be given to the difficulties of carrying on a campaign with very limited funds and the sacrifice of spare time which could be more selfishly used.

ACTUALITIES.

The forces against which we have to contend are powerfully organised, and while it has not deterred us from attacking, we realise that a more fully organised Poultry Industry would have achieved more immediate success. We must lose no time nor lessen effect in securing additional membership to the recognised body working on behalf of the Industry, that is the South African Poultry Association.

VALUES.

Take the mealie question alone. If by our efforts we can secure a reduction of 1/- per bag in the cost of mealies consumed by poultrymen, this means a saving of £250,000 (Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds) to those engaged in the industry. The iniquitous terms of the proposed Mealie Control Scheme, a perpetuation of past injustice, if put into force, will compel the poultrymen of the Union of South Africa to contribute much more than this sum to finance the loss on mealies which have to be exported because the mealie producers' organisations are incapable of working out any scheme which would enable the surplus mealies to be consumed in South Africa for the benefit of South Africa. Not only must the poultrymen of South Africa finance the loss on export, but they are expected to agree (without a kick) that overseas poultrymen shall be able to purchase South African mealies at a price lower than South African poultrymen will pay, and giving the overseas poultrymen the opportunity to produce eggs at a lower food cost than we can here, and send them to our market in competition.

RESPONSIBILITIES.

Does not this one thing alone justify the South African poultryman helping himself, as an individual quite apart from any duty to the Industry, by seeing that the South African Poultry Association, the representative body of the largest consumers of mealies in South Africa, is made strong enough to save at least some of this enormous sum of money for him.

REALISM.

To return to the matter of expansion in the industry. It is not necessarily a healthy sign if an industry expands either rapidly or continuously. The "point of diminishing returns" can arrive in the poultry industry as a whole, just as it can in the case of the individual poultryman, or in any other business or industry. This "point of diminishing returns" is the point of maximum profit per unit of production and is set by such factors as labour, supervision, and prices based on market requirements. Beyond this point it is possible to arrive at a stage where increasing costs and decreasing revenue per unit provide no margin of profit whatever.

FACING FACTS.

Those who have the welfare of the Poultry Industry at heart will realise that we would be failing in our duty if we did not make it very clear, especially under the conditions of this machine age and the now out-of-date financial system, that production can no longer be regarded as an object in itself, but must become a part (and only a part) of a set policy of ensuring a reasonable living for those engaged in the industry in adequately supplying the requirements of the community at a reasonable price. We do not want to repeat the mistake made some years ago, when production was stimulated without regard to marketing, with serious financial results to many. There, again, strong organisation within the industry can achieve beneficial results by meeting and averting dangers before they become serious.

FOR THE FUTURE.

We do not want to build up our industry upon an export market, and, finding that market a weak reed, parasitically bleed our own people to maintain (inevitable) comes, whereby the under-nourished will have access to the abundant fruits of the earth. Uncontrolled expansion of any industry can become a curse and even a political playing card. We shall use every effort to prevent this.
